Crime Prevention Corner

Giving a good description

Community safety and crime prevention is everyone's responsibility. You can assist police by providing a good description of anyone you see committing a crime or acting suspiciously.

When giving a description it is important to try and build a complete picture of a person from head to toe. It is important to take note of the following features:

- Male or female
- Body frame size
- Racial appearance
- Distinguishing clothing
- Age group
- Haircut and colour
- Facial hair
- Scars, tattoos or glasses

If you observe a vehicle being used during a crime or suspicious behaviours it is important to note the:

- Vehicle registration
- Make and model
- Distinguishing signs or text
- Colour
- Any damage or rust
- Direction of travel
