



Redlands College is a Christian, co-educational and independent school offering Prep to Year 12 classes.

The College campus is located on an eight hectare site, situated in the bayside suburb of Wellington Point. Established in 1988 by members of the Churches of Christ, the College is governed by a Board of Directors, while the Principal and his staff are totally responsible for the administration of the College.

Redlands College opened on 1 February, 1988 with 91 students from years 1-8. By the end of 1988 enrolment had grown to 120, and is currently over 1300 students. The first Year 12 class operated in 1992, the Prep program was introduced in 1999 and the Middle School commenced in 2006.

The College welcomes families who seek support in raising their children by providing a high standard of education within a Christian environment. Our teaching staff support the College mission and ethos and contribute to a caring 'family' atmosphere.

Our Christian faith is fundamental to all aspects of the College, from the units of work we teach, resources used in teaching, to our behaviour policy and the relationships between staff, students and parents. Redlands College aims to provide a school with a distinctively Christian emphasis.

Facilities

Redlands College is situated on an eight hectare site at Wellington Point close to rail and bus. We enjoy a mild climate, with cool bay breezes in summer. The College has a variety of specialised facilities to meet the needs of Junior, Middle and Senior school students. In addition, a number of larger facilities are shared by the whole school community, including a modern sports centre, 25m heated indoor swimming pool, two ovals, a large resource library, a number of computer labs as well as an expressive arts building, Science Centre and multi-purpose hall.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care is an integral part of the educational process and places emphasis upon the welfare of the individual. Transport

Travel to the College is available by bus or train. The train runs along the Cleveland line and it is a ten minute walk to the College from the Wellington Point station. Bus services to the College operate throughout the Redlands and the Wynnum/Manly area. Fees are charged each term except for the Wynnum/Manly bus which is a public bus route.
