From its humble beginnings as a small Christian school of 91 students, Redlands College has matured into a centre of Christ-focused learning, committed to academic, sporting and cultural excellence for over 1360 students

In 2014, the College undertook a comprehensive strategic review process in order to develop a blueprint for the College's strategic direction over the following 9 years. The articulation of this direction was structured around three distinct phases.

Phase 1: 2015-2017 - Foundation **Phase 2**: 2018-2020 - Construction

Phase 3: 2021-2023 - Extension

This document articulates the focus of our journey during Phase 3 - Extension

The College's strategic journey over this period is undergirded by five foundation pillars which support our learning community. These foundation pillars honour the work of the College's pioneers and equip the College to reinvigorate learning for the next generation. The process of reflecting on achievements and looking forward to future innovations, will be integrated with these five foundation pillars.

Expressing what it means to be a Christ-centred learning community. Our Christian faith is central to the teaching of our students, development of our staff and engagement with our community.

Our Objectives

- For students to understand their lives in the narrative of God's story through purposeful engagement with the Bible.
- To enhance our standing as a respected academic, musical, sporting and vocational College with a deeply embedded Christian identity, including a clear understanding of Christian character and principles.

Celebrating our Achievements

- Introduction of Character Development Framework to articulate our expectations for student behaviour and quide our discipline and celebration processes.
- Engagement with Christian faith through weekly devotions in P-5 and weekly year level chapels for students in Years 6-12, weekly staff devotions and quarterly whole school chapels.

 Review of College camping program across Years 4-11 and introduction of Year 10 camp and Project Vila

Strategic Preparations

- Investigate and develop P-12 Christian Living Program.
- Implement an effective and supportive P-12 Student Wellbeing Program.
- Continue to develop "The Redlands Way" throughout the College as an expression of college culture and facilitation of staff wellbeing.
- Further develop programs for staff to enhance their understanding of the Christian faith and its role in education

Through intentional teacher practice and continuous improvement and reflection, equipping students with the values, skills and knowledge to respond to God's call on their lives and to contribute positively to the world.

Our Objectives

- To affirm our identity as a Christian school where teaching for learning is embraced.
- To enhance our strong teaching and learning community that is research and evidence-based.
- To embed a culture of innovation and creativity within our College and create inspiring learning spaces.

Celebrating our Achievements

- Staff regularly participating in collaborative engagement, conference presentations and professional development appropriate to subschools.
- Introduction of Research Teacher category to support internal research projects or staff participation in Masters or Doctoral study.
- Introduction of ACCESS program for Senior School students to engage in University, TAFE, Certificate programs, extension subjects, academic tutoring, sport or creative arts.

Strategic Preparations

- Implement an integrated P-12 data plan in conjunction with data literacy professional development for staff.
- Create an environment that supports teacher innovation through activities such as mentoring teacher exchanges and collaborative research projects.
- Consolidate and enhance the provision of developmentally appropriate approaches to each sub-school age group.
- Embed a Teaching & Learning Framework which will guide the development of pedagogy and content across the College.
- Review curriculum offerings to ensure they meet the changing needs of the College community.

Our Objectives

- To continue the strong partnership between our College's governing board and school leadership team.
- To identify and mentor aspiring leaders within our College.
- To develop robust and well-documented systems and processes that support the successful operation and management of our College.

Celebrating our Achievements

- College database transitioned from Denbigh to TASS. Introduction of Learning@Redlands (Schoolbox) as the College's online learning management system.
- Implementation of new organisational structure, established around Directors, Deans and collaborative staff teams.

 Governance capacity has been enhanced through new appointments aligned with the requirements of a skill matrix and participation in governance training courses.

Strategic Preparations

- Review and improve where necessary our school management systems and processes to ensure they contribute to the effective and efficient operation of our College
- Build on our College's governance capacity by continuing to provide training for existing and potential new College Board Directors.
- Provide opportunities for aspiring leaders to participate in leadership development and mentoring programs.
- Implement a Teacher Performance and Development Framework to facilitate renewal and growth.

Celebrating our Achievements


- Completion of College Heart building project, including café, hospitality classrooms, library, student wellbeing precinct and staff workroom and common room.
